Skater Development

As well as the International Squad being busy, the Age/Talent ID development squad have also been busy. The South Island members of this squad came together this past weekend in Dunedin to work with Kevin Poit. Competition simulations and analysing programmes to maximise points were the main objectives of the seminar. Thank you to judges, Grant Howie and Grace Bateman, who worked with the skaters to give feedback on performances from the judges' perspective.

The North Island members of the squad will be working with Kevin on 28 and 29 September at Botany Downs Ice Rink. Again, the focus will be on competition simulation and analysing programmes to maximise points. Judges will also be looking at the programmes and giving feedback to the skaters.

The focus of these Development sessions was different to last year because of the timing of the sessions. Spins, spirals and step sequences were looked at in terms of levels and the GOEs they would receive from judges. Skaters also looked at the layout and distribution of elements as well as the performance and interpretation of their programmes and what Component Marks they would receive for that particular program. Sessions did not focus on jumps or learning new spin positions, etc, due to the timing of sessions in regards to Nationals.

The TES points required for the various Development Squads and for International assignments have been published. The minimum TES points required are as follows:

Age / Talent ID Development Squad

Inclusion is based on results at New Zealand National Championships, Selection Competition or Australian National Championships each year and will be open to those skaters who have placed in the top six in Juvenile to Pre Primary grades and who meet the following minimum Total Element Score (TES). Skaters in this development tier must not have reached the age of 12 as at 1st July preceding the NZ National Championships that year to be included in this development tier. Skaters who are in the Primary and Novice categories and have not reached the age of 14 as at 1st July preceding the NZ National Championships and do not qualify under any other development level may also be included.
