Development Squads and Camps

An error in the Technical Element Scores for Sarah MacGibbon (DISC) in the Novice Ladies Free Skate event means that Sarah has earned the TES points required to be named to the International Development Squad rather than the Talent/Age ID Squad as was announced in NZISA Communication



044 and at the NZ Nationals banquet. Our congratulations and apologies to Sarah, who is currently living, training and competing overseas, and plans to be back in Dunedin in March 2010.

An addition to the Development Squads is Christina Floka (AIFSC). Christina made the required TES points for Novice while competing in the Novice Ladies event at the 2009 Australian National Championships. She entered the NZ Nationals in the Junior Ladies event but was forced to withdraw due to injury after the draw. As she is no longer eligible to compete as a Novice competitor but is too young to skate as a Junior internationally, she has been named to the Talent/Age ID Squad. On behalf of the NZ Skating Community, we would like to wish Christina a full recovery from her injury and congratulate her on being named to the Development Squad.

Development camps for the skaters named to the Talent / Age ID Development Squad will take place in Auckland (27 - 28 February for NI skaters) and Gore (6-7 March for SI skaters). All other NZ skaters who are in the Juvenile to Novice grades are eligible to take part in these development camps at their own cost while the skaters named in the squad will receive partial funding.
