

COACH REQUIRED!

At present the Dunedin Ice Stadium operates with two **self employed Coaches** – We have now been advised that we will lose the services of one of these coaches in December 2010.

If you are an energetic **self employed** full Level 1 certified coach or higher and have a lot to offer to our friendly and growing club, which includes figure skating and speed skating. Note at this stage both coaches spend the majority of their coaching with Ice Figure skating. While this advertised position is self-employed', there will be some subsidising available by the Dunedin Ice Stadium for a limited period.

The Dunedin Ice Skating club Incorporated includes Ice Figure Skating and Short-track Speed Skating. Figure skating is affiliated to the New Zealand Ice Skating Association (NZISA) and our speed skating division is affiliated to New Zealand Ice Speed Skating Association (NZISSA). Both National bodies are affiliated to the International Skating Union (ISU).

D.I.S.C. (Dunedin Ice Skating Club) caters for all levels and all ages.

The Dunedin Ice Skating Club currently has over 170 members who range in age from toddlers to senior citizens and the skating levels range from Beginners to International Representatives.

We have 40 competitive skaters registered but the number is growing. You will be expected to teach singles (from beginner to Senior level), pairs, ice dancing (until Senior level) and synchronized skating. You will be required to teach Club run development programmes, adult skater's sessions as well as private lessons. Our schedule is Monday to Saturday 6-9am for private lessons, five hours a week for group lessons. We always end the year with a Christmas fundraising ice show. The rink is opened all year long. Of course, you must be willing to work alongside the club Committee, Management of the Ice Stadium and our other coach(es).

The Dunedin Ice Stadium was opened in 2004 and has a full size Olympic rink as well as a designated Curling rink both under the same roof. This Ice Stadium is club run with two representatives for each sport making membership of Ice Sports Dunedin Board. The Dunedin Ice Stadium was the host ice rink for the Winter Games New Zealand International Figure Skating Competition in 2009 and will be again in 2011.
