As we reflect on 2024, what an extraordinary year it has been for New Zealand figure skating! Alongside various skater, coach, and officials' development activities, we celebrated several historic firsts:

- Dwayne Li made history by winning the **bronze medal at the Gangwon 2024 Winter Youth Olympic Games**, a monumental achievement and a first for New Zealand.
- Dwayne followed this with an incredible performance on the ISU Junior Grand Prix circuit, becoming the **first Kiwi to win a JGP event** with his gold medal at the Bangkok JGP, and securing a **bronze medal at the Wuxi JGP**.
- His exceptional season culminated in qualifying for and representing New Zealand at the **Junior Grand Prix Final in France**, solidifying his place as a trailblazer for Kiwi skaters.
- Dwayne has been featured in **Golden Skate**, a prestigious platform recognized internationally in the figure skating community. - Renee Tsai placed 11th at the Bangkok JGP and recently made the Junior Worlds TES
- Cara Tang placed 25th at the Wuxi JGP
- Petra Lahti is on course to representing New Zealand at the 2025 World Junior Figure Skating Championships in Hungary

Looking ahead, 2025 promises to be another remarkable year for New Zealand figure skating, and we can't wait to see what the future holds.

DWAYNE LI AND THE ISU JUNIOR GRAND PRIX FINAL 2024

Earlier this month Yanhao (Dwayne) Li made history, yet again, by becoming the first ever New Zealand ice figure skater to qualify and compete in the ISU Junior Grand Prix Final, in Grenoble, France. The competition is held together with its senior level equivalent, Grand Prix Final.

Here is a reflection from Dwayne of his experience:

The Junior Grand Prix Final has been an incredibly valuable experience, filled with both highs and lows, and countless opportunities for growth. Competing at this level has pushed me to recognize areas where I can improve and refine my skills. Watching the senior skaters practice was very inspiring—their jumps, performances, intricate footwork, and overall artistry felt so much more projected when viewed in real life.

OCEANIA INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION AND COACHING SEMINAR, MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA 26 – 28 MAY

Ice Skating Australia and NZIFSA are again co-hosting the Oceania International Competition and Coach Development Seminar. The competition is for Singles, Pairs and Ice Dance for Basic Novice to Senior level skaters and is to run 26-28 May. All skaters selected to the International A & B Teams will be eligible to attend and are encouraged to do so. The competition will be followed by a coach development seminar – dates and moderator still to be confirmed. We will share more details about the competition and the coaching seminar as soon as they become available and will open registration for skaters shortly after.

CLUCAS CUP SELECTION COMPETITION, AUCKLAND 13 & 14 JUNE 2025

As per the NZIFSA Selection Policy, this competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2025 and one week after our National Championships. The competition will be open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized skating, who competed at the 2024 National Championships and who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2025.

DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES FOR 2025

In the January newsletter we will have details of the development activities for the year. Below is a brief outline of what is being planned. We will have additional information and registration forms early in the new year.

Skater Development

We have a number of workshops planned for 2025 with exciting moderators lined up for you.

Dance & SYS upskilling camp in Dunedin & Auckland, time TBC

A three-day workshop, divided between Ice Dance and Synchronized Skating. The focus is on skating skills and introduction to the two disciplines for both skaters and coaches. It is also suitable for skaters with existing experience in these disciplines.

The workshop is intended for level 1-3 coaches and all skaters with Test 0 (Elementary) Stroking or Test 0 (Elementary) Ice Dance, or above, including Adults and Youth Interpretive skaters.

Singles Basic Novice to Senior, Auckland (Botany), 18-21 April 2025

We have secured the ice time and are finalizing moderators for on & off ice sessions.

ISU Technical Controller & Technical Specialist Feedback Session - Auckland (Botany) in May.

Feedback sessions will be offered for International A & B Team Skaters and a Technical Rules training session provided for a wider audience. We are pleased to advise that we will have an ISU Technical Controller and an ISU Technical Specialist, both highly experienced and respected in their fields, providing feedback to our International Representatives. They will also conduct a valuable rule training session for skaters - a rare and invaluable opportunity to gain insights directly from experts who bring a wealth of knowledge and international experience.

Coaching Courses

One KiwiSkate, a Level 1, and a Level 2 Coaching Course are planned for 2025.

- KiwiSkate course Christchurch in February
- > Level 1 Coaching Course Christchurch in February (to run alongside the KiwiSkate course)
- Level 2 coaching course online modules will begin after 2025 National Champs, with the on -ice session planned for early 2026. Given the delays in being able to offer this course we are exploring a mentoring programme for prospective Level 2 coaches.

We are currently in the process of finalizing moderators and dates for the coaching courses mentioned above.
