Early notice of ISU Ice Dance Seminar in Seoul, Korea August 14 – 20, 2016

There will be an International Ice Dance Development Training Seminar for Ice Dance Coaches and Couples of beginner, Novice and Junior (but not lower than Novice Basic skating level) from Asia, Oceania, the Pacific region and South Africa. The age of the couples should be according to the current ISU age requirements for Novice (≥ 10 and <15 years for girls and <17 for boys) and Junior (≥ 13 and <19 years for ladies and <21 for men) Ice Dance Couples, as at 1 July 2016.

Each Member may enter a maximum of 3 Couples and up to 1 alternate and 2 Coaches to the Seminar. The Seminar is also open to Coaches wishing to attend without Skaters at their own cost. Please refer to ISU Communication No. 1990 for more detail.

NEIL GAMBLE'S PASSING

Very sadly, Neil Gamble died on Sunday 3 January following a courageous battle with cancer.

The following is from an email to DISC members from Morgan Figgins

Many of you will know Neil as the person who along with his curling buddies toiled endlessly to ensure that Dunedin had an ice rink after the Big Chill on Kaikorai Valley road closed down. He was determined to build a new facility. Not only did he convince the Council it was a good idea, but once the building was secured he spent endless hours ensuring that the rink was built to his standard, whether it was seeking funding, laying the insulation and the pipes, or building the "best ice in New Zealand'. He set very high standards.

He managed the current rink for the first eight years and will be remembered for running a tight ship. Without Neil's persistence there would be no ice arena in Dunedin today.

Neil helped so many struggling young skaters to learn business skills behind the counter. He was so good to his staff and protected them in all sorts of situations. There was so much good in him and I was very lucky to have had him a part of my skating career; supporting me with a job, funding and ice time to train. I would've never represented New Zealand in Junior & Senior Worlds and many other competitions if it wasn't for his kind heart. He may have come across a little scary/grumpy at times but if you knew him you'd agree that it's once in a life time that you come across a sense of humour like his and it's extremely sad to see the world without it.

STROKING SEMINARS FOR COACHES AND OFFICIALS

The first of the stroking seminars to work with coaches and officials on the new stroking tests took place in Auckland on Sunday 13 December. Further seminars were held in January in Christchurch and Dunedin for coaches and Officials in those areas.
