Further, the Maria Olszewska Memorial in Poland that Isabelle & Ethan had hoped to compete at was cancelled.

For a synchronized skating team to retain their selection, 75% of the team going to the international competition must have been listed as part of the team selected at the NZ national championships and must meet the grade requirements for that competition.

UPCOMING KIWISKATE COACHING COURSES

The NZIFSA are planning four KiwiSkate Coaching Courses and for the first time we will be holding one in the Wellington region.

These courses will be open to new KiwiSkate coaches as well as currently accredited coaches wishing to attain points to maintain their accreditation. The course cost is \$60 plus \$10 for the manual.

The courses cover two levels:

- KiwiSkate Assistant Course individuals must be 14 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and it is recommended they hold an Elementary test in any discipline.
- KiwiSkate Coach Course individuals must be 15 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and must hold an Elementary test in any discipline. Coaches from different codes may apply to the Coaching Director for test dispensation based on their achievements/qualifications.

UPCOMING SKATER DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

Because of ongoing travel restrictions and quarantine requirements we will not be bringing international coaches to New Zealand for these workshops. Instead, for our Basic Novice – Senior Singles, Dance and Synchronized Workshops we will connect with them via an online video platform (e.g. Zoom, Teams, etc.) as we did in 2021.

We do want to highlight that these workshops are being **heavily subsidised** by NZIFSA, utilising some of the funding that we get from the International Skating Union (ISU).

As has been the practice in the last few years, all skaters who are named to the **NZIFSA Development Squads will be further subsidised** by NZIFSA with cheaper registration fees and are eligible for reimbursement of up to half their travel costs to a maximum of 50% of the rates for travel to NZIFSA meeting in sections 3.1 and 3.2 of the Travel and Reimbursement Policy.

Note: Development Squad members will only be eligible for a discounted registration fee for development workshops, if they have returned their training plans to the Skater Development Director by the **15 March 2022** deadline.

Each of the camps will include on-ice and off-ice activities. The expectation is that all skaters **fully participate in all the activities**. Please set aside the time to attend all the activities. In addition to developing your skills and expanding your knowledge of skating, one of the benefits of getting our skaters together for these workshops is the chance to spend time with other people who are as passionate about skating as you are.

Youth Interpretive workshops in Auckland, Christchurch and Dunedin

We have three Youth Interpretive development workshops planned for 2022. Each workshop has between 5 and 6 hours of ice time as well as some off ice activities. We are still working out the details of the off-ice activities, but below please find an indication of likely start and finish times each day for each workshop. Note these times are indicative only, and we will have detailed schedules for participants prior to each seminar.

We apologize for the very late notification for these workshops. Things have been a little stretched lately, not helped of course, by all the uncertainty that the COVID brings.

Who are these workshops for?

These workshops are for skaters aged at least 12 years and not more than 17 years at 1 July 2022, who are not intending to compete in Singles this year. The whole idea is to create an opportunity for this age group to stay involved in skating, even if the more technical elements are not currently within their reach. The skaters do not need to be club members to take part in the workshops. Hopefully if we can spark their interest, they will join clubs so that they can take part in club competitions etc.

ICE DANCE PARTNER TRY OUTS – NOVICE AND JUNIOR AGE-ELIGIBLE SINGLE SKATERS

The Centre of Excellence in Oberstdorf, Germany, in cooperation with the ISU Development Program, has put out a world-wide invitation for Novice and Junior-age single skaters to express an interest in attending an ice dance partner 'mix and match' and to learn the fundamentals of ice dance. The try outs will take place in Oberstdorf from 15 to 18 May 2022 and you must be willing to travel there to participate.

The seminar aims to introduce young single skaters to the ice dancing discipline as an alternative career path. Interested novice and junior athletes get a detailed insight into dancing and ice skating with a partner through various exercises on the ice and in the dance studio. At the same time, the invited international ice dance experts will assess the suitability of the participating athletes for the ice dance category and form potential new ice dance teams from the corresponding talents.

Each ISU Member may enter all interested eligible athletes with no limitation. However, due to the limited Seminar capacity, there will be a selection process, in which the number of entries per region and the potential of the skaters for future development will be considered. The final list of participants will be communicated to NZIFSA after the deadline of 10 April 2022.

RECENT STROKING SEMINARS FOR COACHES & JUDGES

A series of three seminars were held over the weekend of 19 & 20 February. The seminars were held in Dunedin, Christchurch and Auckland, with Caitlyn Paul and Connor McIver as moderators. The purpose of these seminars was to revisit the stroking tests to ensure that coaches and judges had a shared understanding of what the stroking test requirements and expectations are. The new marking system for tests that recognises GOE was also discussed.

The current Covid situation did result in some disruption to the seminars. Connor was finishing his self-isolation period following a Covid test and had to join the Dunedin seminar via Zoom. Connor and Caitlyn were both present to deliver the Christchurch seminar in person, and Connor presented the Auckland one on his own, as Caitlyn was unable to travel to Auckland at that time. A special thank you to Michael Holtz for managing to sort the technical requirements for a remote presentation in Dunedin at short notice.

A significant number of our coaches and judges were able to take part in the seminars (Dunedin, 7 coaches and 5 judges, Christchurch 5 coaches and 3 judges, and Auckland 10 coaches and 4 judges). We would particularly like to acknowledge our coaches and judges from Queenstown who had a very early start to be able to get to the seminar in Dunedin.

There were also a number that were unable attend for a range of reasons (including the requirement to selfisolate having been Identified as a close contacts). We did record the Christchurch and Dunedin seminars and will be making a video available to all our coaches and judges very soon.

OFFICIALS' TRAINING IN 2022

Mock Panels for all Competition Officials - May /June

The plan is to run mock panels in three centres (Auckland, Christchurch and somewhere in Otago/Southland) before the competition season starts. This will give everyone, including Data/Replay Operators, Judges, Tech Specialists and IJS Technicians, a chance to go through their paces before we run our first competitions for the year.

SELECTION COMPETITION, DUNEDIN 18 – 19 JUNE 2022

NZIFSA is holding a Selection Competition in Dunedin 18-19 June 2022. Note, the smaller number of entries anticipated means we can hold this event over two days rather than three.

This competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2022 and one week after our National Championships. The competition will be open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized, who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2022 and meet the citizenship/residency requirements (refer table below). VIRTUAL ANNOUNCEMENT OF 2021 AWARDS

As noted in our December newsletter, we would normally have announced the winners of the Administrator of the Year, Sportsperson of the Year, and have presented the Norman Cameron Cup of Excellence if deemed appropriate, at our Nationals Championships. Due to the cancellation of the 2021 National Championships that wasn't possible. - nights, fundraising, Kiwi Skate coaching sessions

The trophy is only to be awarded if a skater deserves it and fits the above criteria. GATHERING AND EVENTS UNDER THE COVID PROTECTION FRAMEWORK

Under the Covid Protection Framework there are different Rules for activities at the different traffic light levels depending on whether an activity is classified as an Event or a Gathering, and whether vaccine passes are required or not. Sport NZ has provided some additional "<u>Guidance on events...</u>" Based on this and further clarification at an additional Sport NZ forum specifically to discuss events, the Board have determined that club competitions, Otago Southland Champs and test sessions, where we are likely to know most of the people present - can be classed as "gatherings". The Selection Competition, Nationals and North and South Island Champs are deemed "events" at this point in time. Most, but not all, rinks have determined that a Covid Vaccine Pass is required for everyone over 12 years and 3 months. For commercial rinks to remain financially viable at the Orange and Red Traffic Light settings, this decision is a necessity. Ice Sports Southland do not require vaccine passes, though they have communicated to their members that Vaccine Passes may be required for some activities.

COMPETITIONS WILL REQUIRE VACCINE PASS

In addition to any vaccine pass requirements required by a given rink, the NZIFSA Board have confirmed that all competitions will require Vaccine Passes (plus appropriate health measures as deemed necessary – e.g. masks, distancing etc). Test sessions will not require vaccine passes unless already a requirement of the rink. However, additional health requirements need to be in place – particularly where vaccine passes are not required – masks, distancing, no spectators etc. The NZIFSA will be communicating with Clubs and Officials regarding what those additional requirements will be. In the meantime, all requests for judges for test sessions still need to be sent to the NZIFSA Test & Competition Secretary, Ina Paul. This is to help minimise the pressure put on judges to be available to judge if they have concerns regarding their risk of exposure to COVID 19.
