Over the following newsletters we're planning to profile a number of these roles and give you a bit more information about what these roles involve and the people that do them.

## **Child Protection Officer – Imelda-Rose Sheerin**

I am the current Child Protection Officer for the NZIFSA. I am based in Auckland and am currently a Technical Specialist. I was previously a competitive skater to Senior level.

My primary role as the Child Protection Officer is to act as a contact person for the reporting of concerns under the NZIFSA's Child Protection Policy. I also now have responsibility for arranging police checks of coaches and officials as required under NZIFSA's policies.



It is important that the environment in which children participate in figure skating in New Zealand is safe, protected and positive. Staff, coaches, officials, volunteers and parent(s)/caregiver(s) should be familiar with the policy and those 'on the ground' need to take an active role in monitoring compliance with the policy and raising any concerns.
