I am the current Child Protection Officer for the NZIFSA.

I have been involved in New Zealand figure skating for 25 years, as a competitive skater to senior level, as a kiwiskate coach and most recently as a technical specialist. I have also spent some time in Canada during my big OE teaching skating. I now practice as a corporate lawyer, but still try to keep my sporting side alive by running. I completed my first marathon this year—definitely on par with the end of a 4 minute free programme!

My primary role as the Child Protection Officer is to act as a contact person for reporting of concerns under the NZIFSA's Child Protection Policy. Staff, coaches, officials, volunteers and parent(s)/caregiver(s) should be familiar with the



policy and those 'on the ground' need to take an active role in monitoring compliance with the policy.

Figure skating provides children with an opportunity to develop not only their athletic and artistic potential, but also a wide range of other skills that will serve them in good stead for life beyond figure skating. It is crucial that the environment in which children participate in the sport and develop these skills is safe, protected and positive.

The ISU sanctioned competition is held in the Alpine village of Oberstdorf, Germany – the training ground for current world champion Carolina Kostner and the German dancers Nelli Zhiganshina and Alexander Gazsi. The three rink stadium is the centre of training for all winter sports disciplines and it is wonderful to see these young athletes training and living within the stadium. It is a fantastic competition, this year attracting 364 athletes from 37 countries. Each year the numbers grow and each year it is a true delight to meet up with like minded individuals from every country. Many have skated previously but just as many are adult beginner skaters, some because their children skated and some because they love the sport. The common thread is that everyone is there to do their best, and to enjoy the sport they do together. The village is welcoming and the cows herded off to their field each day is true Bavaria.

From the training camp in the days leading up to the event, the three day event that this year some days stretched from 6.00am to 11.00pm and the final closing banquet, it was amazing; lots of

skating, great competitions and renewing friendships.

Anyone who has travelled to this event would encourage all adult skaters to attend. Sue has competed at the competition since the very first one eight years ago and is determined to be one of a few that have been to all 10 competitions. Let's put out a challenge to get stronger representation next year.

64th ISU CONGRESS

The 2012 ISU Congress was held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia 11-15 June. This was a five day conference attended by all ISU Member Countries. New Zealand was represented by Jeanette King (President, and Wendy Clucas (CEO). Sue Petricevic was also there as a member of the ISU Disciplinary Commission.

We left in snow and a temperature at minus 5 degrees and arrived at temperatures in the mid 30's where when the air conditioning was set at 20 we were cold. Our return was a reality check back to winter.

Congress meets every two years, and hold elections once every four years. It is a very busy and intense time where delegates have the opportunity to speak to submissions from Member Countries and vote.

In total there were over 330 proposals presented for consideration by delegates. In addition to proposed changes to the Constitution and General Regulations considered by the full Congress, technical issues were dealt with by the separate branches of Figure Skating and Speed Skating. Many of the rule changes are to be introduced 2014/15 season.

Of real importance to New Zealand was the deletion of preliminary rounds at ISU World Championships. This will place more emphasis on our skaters competing at Internationals and Grand Prix events. This decision also has ramifications to our two ISU Judges who will now not be able to officiate at an ISU World event unless we have skaters qualifying but may go in the draw for Four Continents unless of course we have a skater entered when they can obviously officiate.

We'd like to encourage all athletes to do this online interactive education program available on http://isu.realwinner.org .

By completing the nine modules the skater will be registered as certified. Skaters who have completed this stated it was a good way to learn something new and learn at the time you want. It is reported to be fun as well as being informative.

JUNIOR GRAND PRIX ASSIGNMENTS

Based on New Zealand Skaters results at the 2012 Junior World Championships, ISU allocated New Zealand one entry in three Junior GP events for Ladies Singles and Dance.

Singles Lake Placid, USA 29 August – 2nd September

Lintz, Austria $12 - 16^{th}$ September Dresden, Germany $10 - 14^{th}$ October

Dance Lintz, Austria 12 – 16th September

Istanbul, Turkey 19-23th September Dresden, Germany 10-14th October

Our dance team of Shane Speden and Ayesha Campbell have nominated Linz, Austria and Istanbul, Turkey whilst our Junior Ladies Champion Madelaine Parker will compete at Lake Placid, USA and Dresden, Germany.

lyrin Quigley runner up in the Junior Ladies has declined the opportunity to compete in Linz, Germany.

We were also allocated one entry in two Junior GP's for Mens Singles and one entry in three Junior GP's for pairs Unfortunately we don't have skaters in these grades to fill these positions.

SENIOR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

Morgan Templeton (nee Figgins) has submitted an entry to the US Senior International Competition at Salt Lake City and intends to enter a further International in Graz, Austria to try and gain the TES scores she needs to qualify for 4 Continents and Worlds.

ALLIE ROUT

Some members will remember Allie from Auckland who was a very successful Figure skater holding New Zealand Titles in all Grades, and a recipient of an ISU Development Grant due to her performances at International Competitions and Junior Worlds the first year she qualified. Last year she represented NZ Speed at the Junior World Short Track Speed Skating championships in Melbourne, exceeding all expectations due to limited training and managing to do PB's in all her races.

We congratulate Allie on her achievements and wish her well for the future.

COACHES ACCREDITATION SUB-COMMITTEE

The NZIFSA Coaches Accreditation Policy has been in place for 4 years now - long enough to see what parts of it are working well and to identify where there is room for improvement. The policy is up for review again in the latter part of the year with submissions due 15 October. The NZIFSA Board believe it's therefore timely to relook at our coaches accreditation system to see whether it meets our needs in the manner we had hoped, or if we need to adapt it further. With this in mind the Board have decided to form a sub-committee made up of a cross-section of coaches from across New Zealand, the President, CEO, and Coaching Director. The Board are also looking at whether we can get input from Sport NZ's coaching specialists.

The Board are seeking expressions of interest from coach members who would like to be considered for this sub-committee. The Board will then make the decision as to which 5-7 coaches are appointed, keeping in mind that we will be looking for:

- Reasonable representation from each area
- A range of disciplines
- A range of experience
- Coaches who will communicate with other coaches in their area

It is expected that the sub-committee will meet via Skype on several occasions over the next 2-3 months, and that those involved will need to commit time to collecting information from and providing feedback to coaches in their area and from other sources as deemed necessary.

What the Board expect the sub-committee to achieve

- Identification of what parts of the current system work well
- Identification of what areas need further work
- Development of a vision of where we want our coaches accreditation to be and a plan of how we get there
