OTHER IMPORTANT ANNOUNCMENTS MADE AT THE NATIONALS BANQUET

Norman Cameron Cup of Excellence

The cup is awarded to the skater, couple, pair or team that has excelled in skating over the year, in international competitions (including Australia) or have had an outstanding year in skating. The trophy is only to be awarded if a skater deserves it and fits the above criteria. If there is no skater, couple, pair or team that fit the criteria that year, the trophy will not. It had been several years since we had awarded this cup and the Board were very pleased to be able to award the Norman Cameron Cup of excellence to Michael Durham.



Administrator of the Year

There were only two nominees for the Administrator of the Year award again this year, which was disappointing as we know we have some really great administrators out there in our clubs, but the quality of the two nominees we did have was far from disappointing. The two nominees are Derryn Neaves and Brooke Tamepo.

Derryn is Treasurer for AIFSC, and from the nomination we received, clearly does an outstanding job of keep track of the finances and providing really useful monthly reports to the committee. But in addition to that she puts her hand up to help on competition days, taken on data replay role, has managed to convince her boss to do all the printing of judges sheets for comps, including NI's and Nationals, is there for all the fundraising activities, is there to help out with costumes, makeup, transport etc. In all these roles she clearly makes a very valuable contribution to the running of the club.

The second nominee for this award is Anita Tamepo. Anita is secretary for the West Auckland Ice Skating Club and the North Island Ice Skating Sub Association. Anita is

described as a lynchpin for the club. She often single-handedly coordinates and takes responsibility for the club's major events and functions. As part of NIISSA She is an essential part of a dedicated group of volunteers who ensure that there are training opportunities for skaters throughout the year. Anita has consistently participated in technical panel training and can be found at virtually every North Island competition on the panel as data entry, video replay and occasionally calc.

Derryn and Anita both clearly make a significant contribution to their clubs, but also beyond that. The Board after some deliberation have decided to award the Administrator of the Year award jointly to Derryn and Anita.

Sportsperson of the Year

The Board only received two nominations for this award, which was also very disappointing. The two nominees were Pansie Sun and Charlotte van Uden.

Pansie has been skating since 2007 and has always pushed herself to try new and challenging thing. Not only has she competed in Adult Bronze singles and Interpretive events, she also competed in Adult pairs with Stuart Brown. As a skate school coach at Avondale, she displays huge enthusiasm for the sport. She encourages and supports other skaters by showing them that she is always willing to try something new on the ice. Pansie is also an active club member, helping at club events, and can always be relied upon to supply home baked cookies. She was described in the nomination as a wonderful ambassador for the sport.

The second nomination for this award is for Charlotte Van Uden. Charlotte started skating in 2003 when she was 6. Charlotte is incredibly hard working and very determined. She has set herself many skating related goals and has striven hard to achieve them. Charlotte is an incredibly good sport and is never heard saying a bad word about anyone. She always takes the time to smile and interact with younger skaters and is always positive and supportive of them our on the ice. Charlotte always remembers to congratulate other skaters and constantly displays the very best of attitude – making her a great role model for other skaters. Charlotte has also worked as a skate school coach, and been part of the "Disney squad", showing great team spirit and the ability to work with skaters of all ages and abilities.

The Board are very pleased to announce that Charlotte Van Uden was appointed as Sportsperson of the Year.

The Allchurch Shield

The Shield is named after Sandy Allchurch and is awarded to the club that gets the highest number of points, based on where their members place in the various grades, at our New Zealand National and Adult Skating Championships. Sandy Allchurch was actively involved in the Association for many years and was at the inaugural meeting in June 1937 of what was, until 2011, the New Zealand Ice Skating Association. Sandy was also Patron for our Association for many years, and was very dedicated to supporting ice skating. Being able to present this award each year is a rather special acknowledgement to Sandy and the contribution that he, and others like him, have made to our sport.

Again this year it was a very close competition. As the adults had yet to compete it wasn't possible to announce the winners at the banquet. When all the results had been included at the conclusion of the adult grades, the Allchurch Shield was won jointly by Auckland Ice Figure Skating Club and Dunedin Ice Skating Club. Well done to both clubs.
