
#### **SELECTIONS FROM THE 2017 NEW ZEALAND ICE FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS**

#### OTHER IMPORTANT ANNOUNCMENTS MADE AT THE NATIONALS BANQUET

#### **Norman Cameron Cup of Excellence**

The cup is awarded to the skater, couple, pair or team that has excelled in skating over the year, in international competitions (including Australia) or have had an outstanding year in skating. The trophy is only to be awarded if a skater deserves it and fits the above criteria. If there is no skater, couple, pair or team that fit the criteria that year, the trophy will be held until the following year. The Board decided that this year the award will not be presented.

#### Administrator of the Year

There were only two nominees for the Administrator of the Year award again this year, which was disappointing as we know we have some really great administrators out there in our clubs, but the quality of the two nominees we did have was far from disappointing. The two nominees were Kirsty Cox and Mike Slater.

Kirsty has been on the Canterbury Masters Committee since 2013 and is currently Vice President. She has also a member of the South Island Ice Skating Sub Association committee since 2013 where she was elected as Treasurer and is still the current Treasurer. She is fully involved in the organisation of the SI Championships and the 2016 National Championships that were held in Christchurch. Kirsty is the Captain of Spectrum Synchro Team and is responsible for communications within the team, booking off-ice venues, fundraising and is always available for other fundraising ventures. She is currently an NZIFSA judge for Singles, Pairs, Dance and Synchro and has been involved for the past 3-4 years. Kirsty puts her hand up to help for anything she can, and is much more significant when you realise that Kirsty has two fully dependant special needs children aged 14 & 18.

The second nominee for this award is Mike Slater. Mike, a skater in a previous life, is one of the Dad's who is always there supporting the sport of his daughter. He started off helping setting up competitions for AIFSC back in the day when the set up team had to be at the rink at 5am. Becoming tired of the water-logged platforms he quietly decided to make new water-resistant platforms for the judges and when the judges asked if it was possible to have steps up to the platform, the next competition, the steps were in place. Mike joined the AIFSC committee in 2014, and along with building and installing a new club notice board, he has progressed to learning the role of Accountant and Calc operator. He now helps all clubs with the physical computer setup and then sits in the cold, usually on both competition days, doing calc. He has also been instrumental in the cable trays for the NI system so judges do not need to worry about kicking or pulling out the many cables. In 2015 Mike joined the AIFSC Synchro Sub Committee and in 2016 became the Chairperson as well as the Vice President of AIFSC Committee. Nothing is ever too hard for Mike and he quietly tackles the many tasks given with quiet efficiency all the while with a smile on his face. Mike no only spends many hours volunteering for AIFSC but he is also a volunteer and supporter of the Pakuranga Rugby League Club, spending many hours there as well.

The Board, after quite some deliberation, decided to award the Administrator of the Year award to both Kirsty and Mike.

#### **Sportsperson of the Year**

The Board only received one nomination for this award. The nomine was Hannah May Slater.

Hannah-May started skating in the Kiwi Skate programme in 2010 and is currently a member of Black Ice Mixed Age Synchro Team and has always worn her AIFSC blue jacket with pride, even during public sessions and is a great draw card for her club. She is a caring skater who is happy to form 'ice-buddy' friends with younger team members showing them the ropes and how to do various synchro moves. At competition time, Hannah-May can be found in the dressing room helping parents with hair and make-up. Even when injured Hannah-May is still seen at the rink for competitions from beginning to the end, helping and supporting everyone. Hannah-May has completed her Kiwi Skate School Coaching course and is always available to do the holiday skate school programme at Paradice. She consistently takes part in club fundraising whether it be chopping onions or selling the most boxes of chocolates. Hannah-May can often be seen helping committee members set up and pack down of Club Champs, carrying boxes, food, trophies and running all kinds of errands as required.

The Board are pleased to award the Sportsperson of the year award to Hannah-May Slater.

#### The Allchurch Shield

The Shield is named after Sandy Allchurch and is awarded to the club that gets the highest number of points, based on where their members place in the various grades, at our New Zealand National and Adult Skating Championships. Sandy Allchurch was actively involved in the Association for many years and was at the inaugural meeting in June 1937 of what was, until 2011, the New Zealand Ice Skating Association. Sandy was also Patron for our Association for many years, and was very dedicated to supporting ice skating. Being able to present this award each year is a rather special acknowledgement to Sandy and the contribution that he, and others like him, have made to our sport.

As the adults had yet to compete it wasn't possible to announce the winners at the banquet. When all the results had been included at the conclusion of the adult grades, the Allchurch Shield was won by Auckland Ice Figure Skating Club. Congratulations AIFSC.

#### PRESENTATION OF LIFE MEMBER AWARD TO SANDRA WILLIAMSON-LEADLEY

The Board awarded Sandra Life Membership at the AGM in April and would like to acknowledge the huge contribution that Sandra has made to the NZIFSA by presenting her with this Life Membership Certificate. Sandra has been Involved in ice figure skating in New Zealand since 1983 – first as a coach, then as an official.



In addition to her coaching and judging contributions Sandra has been actively involved in the Association since 2002. Initially she was involved as a member of the National Technical Committee of what was then the New Zealand Ice Skate Association. She was a member of the NZISA Council from 2004 - 2011, first as a Councillor, before being Vice President for two years and then as President for four years. When the NZISA restructured and changed our name in 2011 Sandra became the NZIFSA Technical Director 2011 – April 2014, NZIFSA CEO April 2014 – April 2017 and she is now the Skater Development Director for the Association

Sandra has made and continues to make, a significant contribution as a moderator for Judges' and Official's Education and presenting seminars/conducting training on the ISU Judging System throughout NZ and in Australia. She also conducts seminars for skaters, coaches and parents. Beyond New Zealand, Sandra is a representative on the ISU ad hoc Education group (2016 – present). On behalf of the NZIFSA I offer our heartfelt and sincerest thanks.
