SELECTIONS TO THE NZIFSA DEVELOPMENT SQUAD

Last year we extended the selections for the NZIFSA Development Squad to include Pre-Elementary and Elementary skaters, with their selections being made at the North Island or South Island Figure Skating Championships. The rest of the development squad members were selected based on their performance at our National Championships. Earlier this year, after consultation with members, we revised the policy so that, in addition to the development squad selections that took place at our National Championships, all grades were also eligible for selection at the North Island or South Island Figure Skating Championships. These championships were held over the last two weekends, and it gives us great pleasure to announce that the following skaters have been selected to the NZIFSA Development Squad to date.

Forums at Nationals

There will be a series of forums to be held on the Saturday starting at 12.30pm – and running till approx. 4pm. These forums will all be held next door to the rink at the St Columba Church.

Anti-Doping Forum – we have an education officer from Drug Free Sport NZ giving a presentation, and skaters and coaches will have a chance to meet our own Anti-Doping Officer – Wendy Thompson.

Stroking Forum – we've had some useful feedback which has been taken on board, and the plan is to finalise the new stroking patterns at this forum.

Rules and Regulations Forum – this is an opportunity for the Technical Director to present, and for members to discuss, the proposed changed to the Rules and Regulations. The proposed changes are posted in the member's forum on the NZIFSA website - nzifsa.org.nz

Problems and Solutions Forum – what are the big challenges we face as a sport, at the individual as well as the organisational level, and what can we do to address those problems.

Club administration Forum – the CEO and President are seeking ideas on how Clubs and the Association can better support each other's activities.

In addition to the above forums, there will also be a **Program Component Seminar for Judges**. The time and location of this seminar have still to be confirmed.

ISU Development Trophy - Cape Town, South Africa, 21-27 November, 2015.

A call for expressions of interest has been sent out to those skaters that have already met the NZIFSA Development Squad selection criteria and are age eligible for the Development Trophy. Unfortunately these dates don't necessarily work so well for our older skaters that will have end of year exams, or for those skaters that are planning to compete at the Australian Figure Skating Championships 27 Nov – 4 Dec, but we still hope to have some skaters attend this event.

Tuesday 4th August

All team members were on the same flight from Auckland, and I met up with them in the departures hall at Sydney International Airport.

After a slight delay while Qantas replaced a dirty oven they deemed to be a fire hazard, we took off and had an uneventful flight, arriving safely into Bangkok. We regrouped after collecting our luggage, met the event representatives, and were transferred to the Brighton Hotel by shuttle vans.



Wednesday 5th August

Harrison was the first skater to have his official practice later in the morning. The other skaters went with coaches/chaperones to have a look around the local area, returning in time to attend the opening ceremony.



The opening ceremony consisted of local skaters in a range of costumes representing different regions and activities of

> Thailand, performing a group routine, plus flag and banner bearers for each country, a traditional puppet display and many speeches.

> Junior Men and Ladies had their practice later that night, with Brooke finishing up after midnight.

Thursday 6th August

All skaters had another practice earlier today, and then competed in the Short Programme.

It could have been a long day at the rink for everyone, but with the rink-hotel shuttles running every hour, the coaches and chaperones were able to stay and travel with each skater as required in order to give the best preparation time and space possible. I went to the rink with the first skater, and remained there in order to time practices and be available as required until the last skater had finished.



Everyone had a solid skate, although the ice seemed to be difficult across the board - with many skaters, from all countries and across all grades, slipping and falling at unexpected times in their programmes, and struggling with elements that were usually strong. Our skaters were philosophical that all skaters were dealing with the same conditions, and therefore they were not using the ice condition as an excuse for any part of their performance they were not happy with. Instead they used the opportunity to take the time to reflect, adjust and focus on how to perform better in their Free Skates.

Friday 7th August

Harrison practiced and competed in his Free Skate, narrowly missing out on a Bronze medal. Although not achieving as well as he hoped, he was positive and upbeat about the lessons he had learnt, and what he wanted to do to improve on future performances.

Junior Ladies and Men had their practice later the same evening.

Saturday 8th August

Another practice for Junior Ladies and Men this morning, before competing in their Free Skate in the afternoon.

As with Harrison, although the final results were not as they would have liked, they performed well under the circumstances and gained insight into what they need to work on for the upcoming International Season.

We all waited to watch the Senior Ladies and Men compete, and to watch the final presentations afterwards.

After heading back to the hotel, most of the team joined several of the Australian Team for an evening out to celebrate. We caught the local Sky Train to a night market, however this was in the process of closing.

Sunday 9th August

After last minute sight-seeing in the morning by some of the team, we travelled to the airport to check in for the flight home. Rosie had some creative packing to do to at the airport with her cushions... Michael and Graeme stayed for an extra day, flying back on Monday.

I was very impressed with the maturity and commitment shown by all skaters. They all conducted themselves extremely well. I was proud to be there to support them, and would happily travel with any of them again.
